New Courses at Your UB

Bachelor of Technology Education

VTAC Code: 37391 CSP; 37392 Non-CSP

Course Outline: This professional qualification delivers the theory and practice of education as well as a course of study in a variety of specialist technology subjects. The topics of study may include: Materials and Processes, Wood Construction Technology, Plastics Fabrication Technology, Electronics and Control Systems, Technology Design and Development, Auto/Mechanical Systems Technology, Food and Technology and Textiles.

Career Opportunities: This degree prepares graduates for a career as a secondary teacher in technology. Technology Teachers are currently in high demand.

Bachelor of Teaching (Early Childhood Education)

VTAC Code: 37371 CSP; 37372 Non-CSP

Course Outline: The course has been designed to build upon students' existing knowledge and focus on the development of the professional attributes of teaching. Applicants will have completed a Diploma of Children's Services or an approved equivalent.

Career Opportunities: This course offers opportunities for qualified child care workers in the early childhood field to achieve professional status as a pre-school or kindergarten teacher. Pre-School Teachers are currently in high demand.

Bachelor of Arts/ Bachelor of Education

VTAC Code: 37351 CSP, 37352 Non-CSP

Course Outline: This professional qualification delivers the theory and practice of education as well as a liberal arts course of study with a variety of major and minor studies. The areas of major study include: Psychology, Language other than English, Literature and Social Science.

Career Opportunities: This joint degree prepares graduates for a career as a liberal arts secondary teacher or a diverse range of careers as an Arts graduate.

Bachelor of Mathematical Sciences/Bachelor of Education

VTAC Code: 37311 CSP, 37312 Non-CSP

Course Outline: This professional qualification delivers the theory and practice of education as well as a mathematics and information technology course of study. The topics of study include mathematical computing, general computing, databases, statistics, applied mathematics, mathematical modelling, optimisation and project management.

Career Opportunities: This joint degree prepares graduates for a career as a secondary teacher in mathematics or information technology. Additionally it prepares graduates for a range of non-teaching careers in mathematics or information technology. Mathematics and IT Teachers are currently in high demand.

Bachelor of Science/ Bachelor of Education

VTAC Code: 37331 CSP 37332 Non-CSP

Course Outline: This professional qualification delivers the theory and practice of education as well as a course of study in a variety of science disciplines. The topics of study may include Biochemistry, Chemistry, Ecology, Engineering, Environmental Science, Geosciences, Health, Biomedical Science, Physics, Psychology and Food Science Technology.

Career Opportunities: This joint degree prepares graduates for a career as a secondary teacher in science. Additionally it prepares graduates for a range of non-teaching careers in science. Science Teachers are currently in high demand.



Education Courses at Your UB

Bachelor of Education (P-6 or P-10)

VTAC Code: 37251 CSP; 37252 Non-CSP

Course Outline: The four-year Bachelor of Education course offers you the choice of training to be either a primary school teacher (P-6), or a primary and middle years teacher (P-10). The course includes core studies in the areas of Education, Curriculum, and Professional Practice, as well as studies from a sequence/s of discipline-specific units. The Bachelor of Education course will prepare you for the roles expected of professional educators, now and into the future.

Career Opportunities: The Bachelor of Education course qualifies you to teach students in the primary years (P-6), or primary and middle years of schooling (P-10).

Master of Education Studies

Course Outline: The Master of Education Studies provides students with maximum flexibility within structured pathways that support their success. This approach is underpinned by an education philosophy that recognises students as self-actualising learners, particularly when they are professionals with relevant experience and expertise. The aim is to centre their expertise, common interests and understandings and build on collegial networks within the course structure enabling students to support each other, gain confidence as researchers and succeed with course requirements.

All units will be supported through on-line materials and discussion forums.

Career Opportunities: Successful completion of the Master of Education Studies will enhance your professional standing in the Educational Community and may lead to employment opportunities in the Tertiary Sector.

Graduate Diploma of Education (Secondary)

This course is delivered on the Mt Helen campus and can be completed over one year of full-time study. Anyone completing this course is accredited by the Victorian Institute of Teaching and graduates are eligible for registration as secondary teachers in Victoria. Students typically include recent graduates, parents returning from family care to the workforce, people seeking a mid career change and international students.

Master of Education (Coursework - Majoring in Special Education)

Course Outline: The Master of Education (Coursework - majoring in Special Education) program is an exciting, innovative and flexible program designed to meet the needs of teachers wishing to teach either in the special school system or to work with students with particular learning needs, including gifted students and/or students with disabilities within regular schools and special settings. The course offers students a critical familiarity with issues and questions relevant to the field of special education, and research in special education.

Career Opportunities: Successful completion of the Master of Education with a major in Special Education will qualify you for employment in specialist educational settings and will enhance your professional standing within the Education Community.

Graduate Certificate in Education (Professional Learning)

This course is delivered on campus and can be completed over one semester of full-time study or over a year of part-time study. Anyone completing this course can articulate with a range of Graduate and Master level courses offered by the School of Education. Students typically include staff from schools, universities, TAFE and Adult Continuing Education, the police force, nursing, as well as organisational learning and development professionals from private industry.
